

Here's what People are Saying:

The Adult Drug Treatment Court Program diverts nonviolent felons, with substance abuse problems, from incarceration in jail and/or prison. Participants also include Department of Corrections probationers who are sentenced to the program as a condition of probation or as a probation violation, and parole violators. Participants are given an opportunity to become involved in substance abuse treatment and to comply with other requirements such as attending bi-weekly court sessions, submitting random urinalysis samples, and reporting to program staff. They must also follow up on referrals made to other community agencies, which may include the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Housing Resources, Maternal Support Services, the YWCA Sexual and Domestic Assault Programs, the Upjohn Institute for Employment Research and others. In order for a defendant to participate in the Drug Treatment Court Program, the defendant must enter a guilty plea to the charge(s). The defendant is represented by counsel during the plea process and may file a motion to set aside and dismiss the plea upon successful completion of the program.
